Melanie Mason brings in the New Year with "Change!"

Melanie Mason of North Country Daylilies will be our guest speaker at the Sunday, January 22nd, 2017, meeting of the Capital Hudson Iris Society at the East Greenbush Library at 1:30 p.m. Her talk is entitled "Change!" – she will follow the changes in daylilies from the 1950's through today. As her talk details, daylily fashion has varied as much as hemlines!

Melanie Mason came to daylilies in a roundabout way. Her first career was as an elementary art teacher, but after determining that she preferred children in small quantities, she went back to school for a degree in ornamental horticulture. She worked in the landscaping business for over a decade, and through a chance meeting with Pat and Grace Stamile, discovered the wonders and variety of daylilies. With Pat and Grace's encouragement, she began hybridizing. That was nearly 25 years ago, and in the period since, she has registered over 120 daylilies, won 11 Honorable Mentions and one Award of Merit from the American Hemerocallis Society (AHS). Melanie served AHS Region 4 as Regional Vice President for four years, on the AHS Board of Directors for six, and is on the AHS Registration committee. She continues to hybridize at the farm that she and husband Bob have in Buskirk, NY, in nearby Washington County. There they raise Black Angus cattle as well as daylilies. With 450 acres, over 120 cows, three Labrador retrievers, and nearly 1000 daylilies, they stay pretty busy! Melanie sells daylilies through her web-site www.northcountrydaylilies.com and also in the summer on weekends during bloom season, when they welcome visitors.

We're very pleased to have such a well-known and knowledgeable speaker to educate us on plants that many of us grow and want to learn more about. The meeting begins at 1:30 with coffee and cake, there will be a short business meeting at 2:00 and Melanie will begin right after that. Bring a friend and a dessert or appetizer to share.
