June 10th Bus Trip to Elizabeth Park Gardens in Hartford

There are still tickets left for the bus trip on Sunday, June 10, to Elizabeth Park Gardens in Hartford, Ct. and to John O'Brien's Nursery in East Granby, Connecticut. If you've been waiting to sign up until you knew your schedule (and until the weather warmed up), wait no longer! We expect to get the bus filled by June 1st, next Friday. Elizabeth Park is on the national register of historic places. There are just over one hundred acres of formal gardens (two rose gardens), a perennial garden, green space, recreational facilities, walking loops and the Pond House Café. Many people have it on their "bucket list" of places to visit – come see why!

The Wade bus will leave Crossgates Mall upper peripheral parking lot on the west side of the mall at 8:00 a.m. sharp, so be on time!

Be sure to bring a cardboard carton clearly marked with your name on it if you expect to buy any plants at John O'Brien's Nursery in East Granby, where we will be stopping on the way home. For those of you who have been there, you know you'll need at least one box! He's got gorgeous things and many unusual selections. August 1st Rhizome Party And August 4th Sale

The Iris Rhizome Dig is on Wednesday, August 1st at Euthemia's home, 13 Hartwood Road, Delmar, from 9-12. At the dig we'll take your clumps of clearly labeled irises (put them in separate plastic bags and write on the outside of the bag which one is inside), we'll clean, trim and divide them into separate rhizomes, and mark each rhizome with a label that has the name and description of the flower. Then we put them into a bag that has a picture and description of the iris on it and bring the bags of rhizomes to the Rhizome Sale at Faddegon's Nursery on Saturday, August 4th. Anyone planning on digging irises from their garden should **let Euthemia know their names by July 26th** (at the latest, earlier is better). She'll make labels and pictures for the bags so the work goes quickly at the Dig. In addition to what we dig here, Bob and Ann Keup are planning to send some of their bearded irises from Maine for the sale. Even if you don't have any irises to contribute to the sale, your help will be appreciated at the dig. You'll enjoy the camaraderie and learning as well as the coffee and bagels!

The sale is just a few days later, on Saturday, August 4th, from 9-12 at Faddegon's Nursery, 1140 Troy-Schenectady Road (Route 7) in Latham. As everyone who has been there knows, the Rhizome Sale is the best place to buy new bearded irises! If you have any questions, call Euthemia at 439-3758 or send her an email.

Capital Hudson Iris Society is sponsoring a bus trip to Elizabeth Park Gardens in Hartford, Connecticut, on Sunday, June 10. **The Wade bus will leave Crossgates Mall upper peripheral parking lot on the west side of the mall at 8:00 a.m. sharp, so be on time!** The cost is \$40 per person including a bagel and juice breakfast on the bus. Fill out the form below, enclose a check made out to **CHIS**, and send it to the address indicated. Reservations will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Elizabeth Park has many gardens to visit. Established in 1904, the Elizabeth Park Rose Garden is the oldest municipal rose garden and the third largest in the United States today. In addition, the Heritage Rose Garden, with the magnificent fragrances of old roses, is known throughout the country. The Perennial Garden was redesigned by Frederick McGourty in the 1980s and over 1600 new perennials were added. There are annual gardens, a shade garden, greenhouses, a Pond House Garden with a café, ponds and stone bridges. You won't be bored at Elizabeth Park and you'll probably have a hard time seeing it all in one day. Log onto www.elizabethparkct.org to get a hint of what's in store.

On the way home, we will stop at John O'Brien's Nursery in East Granby, Connecticut, where you will be able to buy beautiful perennials, shrubs and their specialty, hosta. They have hundreds of hosta. Be sure to bring a large carton or two with you to store your purchases under the bus.
