"If Hydrangeas Be the Flower of Summer, Plant On!" with Eli Joseph-Hunter and Briana Davis

We're bringing back as our guest speakers Eli Joseph-Hunter and Briana Davis of the Greene Bee Greenhouse in Cornwallville, NY. Eli and Briana have a beautiful nursery in the northeast part of Greene County and are very knowledgeable growers. They will give a talk entitled "If Hydrangeas be the Flower of Summer, Plant On!" Hydrangeas are a special love of theirs and we are sure to learn some great tips on what selections do best in our gardens. In addition, they will also be **bringing a mix of shrubs and perennials with fall interest, and probably a handful of different Hydrangeas for sale!** Bring your checkbook or cash because you know their plants are not to be missed. And since they're already in pots, you'll be able to put them right into the ground without missing a beat.

Greene Bee Greenhouse is an uncertified organic nursery specializing in growing select trees and shrubs as well as perennials and vegetable seedlings. It is located about 40 minutes southwest of Albany in the foothills of the Catskills outside Greenville. Eli and Briana strive to cultivate a healthy ecology from the soil up by using copious amounts of compost and only organic fertilizers, promoting a biologically diverse soil system that supports sustained and healthy plant growth. They grow and sell plants that, to the best of their knowledge, co-exist peacefully with the indigenous species of our region, while simultaneously striving to offer a broad and unique variety.

The meeting begins at 1:30 p.m. with coffee and cake (bring something to share, we'll provide the beverages). There will be a short business meeting at 2:00 and the speakers will begin right after that. The East Greenbush Community Library is located two blocks east of the intersection of Route 4 and Route 151 in East Greenbush, just south of Exit 9 of I-90.
