'Holidays in December' Designs by WNYIS



The Horticultural Division is probably the most popular division in an iris show. However, there are also divisions for seedlings, youth, educational, commercial, and artistic design. The Artistic Design Division was judged by trained judges who specialized in this field. In 2022 the AIS developed its own design certification program whereby accredited AIS judges can train in the art of design judging. The program also allows AIS Judges, who have already received training through other garden clubs, to be grandfathered in if specific requirements are met. Several judges in WNYIS expressed an interest in this program and sessions were organized. Joanne Bassett, Master Judge, shares her experiences from one of the sessions held in December.

The Western New York Iris Society is in the process of grandfathering in our AIS judges for the design certificate issued by the AIS. On December 4th our group had the second meeting of this program. Our assignment was to make a design that celebrated "Holidays in December". All our members, judges, and non-judges were invited to participate.

Six of the members took on this assignment. As you can see from Dave Baehre's photos, the designs produced were varied with each designer having their own unique interpretation of the theme.

Our group is fortunate to have three AIS members, Marilee Farry, Maria Gerbracht, and Annette Kuhn, who are also certified judges of the 8th District Garden Clubs of New York State. They skillfully judged each design. Each designer was instructed on what to avoid when creating a design, as well as provided with pointers on how to improve and better meet the design requirements. All other participants gave their critiques. All the discussions were given in such a kind and helpful way that, for me, it was the best meeting we have had. There was much laughter and shared enjoyment.

Of course, we had a delicious meal to close this session. I am looking forward to our next design assignment. I am sure that at our June 3rd show the judges will have many unique and beautifully made designs to review. Know you are invited. 2022 AIS Tall Bearded Iris Symposium

(American Iris Society Results vs Region 2 Best Performers)

When determining which perennials may grow well in their gardens, gardeners will usually look towards the award winners. If you have ever grown Geranium 'Rozanne', which received the Award of Garden Merit from the Royal Horticultural Society plus the Perennial Plant of the Year award from the Perennial Plant Association, you will understand the reasoning behind selecting proven winners.

However long-time iris growers will tell you that, regardless of the awards an iris has received, they don't always perform the same in different parts of the continent. An iris that performs well on the west coast may not perform as well in our colder climate in the northeast. Each of us has our own stories to tell. This is where the results from the AIS TB Symposium can help.

By separating the regional results from the national results you can see which irises perform well in our region. Knowing which irises others have had success with could help you determine which ones may perform in your garden. For this reason it is important that each of us completes the AIS TB Symposium that comes with our AIS Bulletin in the spring.

The results from 2022 show that we continue to select award winners. 'Immortality', which has held the number one position since 2018, remains on the list however it has relinquished its crown to the 2021 Wister Medal recipient, 'Don't Stop Believing' (Johnson, 2013).

RVP Report

Audit Committee Report

Annette Kuhn reported that the paperwork for the Audit Committee is ready for review. She will email it to all Affiliate chairs, asking one of them to assume the role of Committee chair.

Treasurer Report

Annette Kuhn reported that as of October 1, 2022, Region 2 of the American Iris Society has \$9,399.49 on account. Since January 1, 2022, revenue totaling \$97.75 has been received while \$726.90 has been expended.

A budget for 2023 of \$2,129,00 was proposed. The Newsletter budget decreased by \$50, the RVP AIS Convention registration fee decreased by \$10, and the Treasurer's budget was increased by \$14. Annette to investigate reason for \$2 per month bank charge to determine if it can be avoided.

Motion, as amended, by Neil Houghton to pay the early registration fee to the 2023 AIS National Convention for the RVP or his/her designee. This amount is not to exceed \$350.00. Motion carried.

Motion by Cara Hutchings to accept the Budget as proposed and present it at the General Meeting on October 22nd. Motion carried.

WNYIS will have its 2023 show on June 3rd. CHIS, GRIS, and ONIS have not finalized the dates of their 2023 shows. There are currently no virtual shows planned for 2023.
