## Iris Sale, Sat. August 7th Iris Prep, Wed. August 4th

The Iris Sale at Faddegon's Nursery in Latham will be held on **Saturday**, **August 7, 9 a.m. -12 noon at Faddegon's Nursery**, 1140 Troy-Schenectady Road (Route 7), Latham – about 2.5 miles west of Exit 6 of the Northway. All CHIS workers will be masked and vaccinated. We hope you will be, too!

This is the first sale since August 2019 and there will be some wonderful irises that have been developing for an extra year without division. Bob Keup is sending many bearded and beardless irises from Maine (see picture below) and Kathryn Mohr is digging from her beautiful garden in Ballston Lake. If you have named irises that are big enough to divide, please contact Euthemia immediately so that you can share some of them with us for the sale.

The sale will include iris rhizomes (tall bearded, medians, standard dwarf, etc.) and a selection of bare root Siberian irises. Bare root means just what it sounds like – the irises come wrapped in damp paper towels and plastic to preserve the roots and keep them ready for planting. When you get home, you either plant them directly in the ground where you want them to be or pot them up for later planting when it isn't so hot. Siberians do well when we buy them bare root from iris hybridizers and should do well when you get them from us!

To prepare for the iris sale, there will be an "Iris Digging Party" at Euthemia's house in Delmar a few days before the sale, on **Wednesday, August 4<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m.** It usually takes us 2-3 hours to finish marking and bagging all the irises. If you're free, do come. We'll teach you how to do it – it's easy and you learn a lot about irises. If you can, bring a folding chair, a pair of scissors, black Sharpies if you have any, and a stapler. Bagels and coffee will be served. The address is 13 Hartwood Road, off Dumbarton Drive, in Delmar. Call if you need directions – 518 439-3758.
