## CHIS is Back! Iris Sale August 7th

It's so strange to be writing this newsletter again – it feels like we've been in a state of suspended animation and are just beginning to move around. And I guess to a certain extent, it's true.

Although all activities are not back, the first one we feel comfortable doing is the annual Iris Sale at Faddegon's Nursery in Latham on the first Saturday of August. Put it on your calendars: Saturday, August 7, 9 a.m. -12 noon at Faddegon's Nursery, 1140 Troy-Schenectady Road (Route 7), Latham. It's about 2.5 miles west of Exit 6 of the Northway. All CHIS workers will be masked and vaccinated!

The sale will include iris rhizomes (tall bearded, medians, standard dwarf, etc.) and a selection of bare root Siberian irises. Bare root means just what it sounds like – the irises come wrapped in damp paper towels and plastic to preserve the roots and keep them ready for planting. When you get home, you either plant them directly in the ground where you want them to be or pot them up for later planting when it isn't so hot. Siberians do well when we buy them bare root from iris hybridizers and should do well when you get them from us!

Bob Keup is again planning to send us many beautiful irises (rhizomes and Siberians) from his garden in Maine. We also need you to look at the irises you have in bloom now and if you know their names and they are big enough to divide, share some of them with us for the sale. Mark them now for digging.

The iris sale is the only way CHIS makes money to pay speakers for our future meetings. Although we don't have any meetings planned yet because the East Greenbush Library is not open for scheduled meetings, we know we'll be able to start planning speakers sometime in the next few months. We've got a list of speakers we had planned for 2020 and we hope they will be available when we "get rolling" again.

To prepare for the iris sale, there will be an "Iris Digging Party" at Euthemia's house in Delmar a few days before the sale, on Wednesday, August 4<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. It usually takes us 2-3 hours to finish marking and bagging all the irises. If you're free, do come. We'll teach you how to do it – it's easy and you learn a lot about irises. If you can, bring a folding chair, a pair of scissors, black Sharpies if you have any, and a stapler. The address is 13 Hartwood Road, off Dumbarton Drive, in Delmar. Call if you need directions – 518 439-3758.

There will be additional information about the Digging Party in next month's newsletter. I'd appreciate an email note letting me know that you'll be coming to the Digging Party so I have enough bagels and coffee for all! Glad to be back!
