AIS Region 2 Meeting Oct. 19 & 20 at the Delmar Presbyterian Church

A special event you shouldn't miss!

You've still got time to send in your registration form (or notify Euthemia by e-mail) for the AIS Region 2 meeting October 19 & 20th at the Delmar Presbyterian Church, 585 Delaware Avenue, Delmar (corner of Cherry/Elm and Delaware Avenues). We have lined up a great keynote speaker from Texas, Bonnie Nichols, Chairperson of the Novelty Iris Society, a relatively new subgroup of the American Iris Society. Bonnie's talk is entitled "Novelty Irises: Looking Forward, Looking Back". She will give us a good background on novelties and let us know what's in the works for the future. Novelties are irises with broken color, an odd number of falls, perhaps no standards, space age irises with horns (some fuzzy) and hooks, flatties, those with variegated foliage, and some with overlapping falls. Bonnie is a great speaker and the weekend promises to be both educational and enjoyable. She will also give two judges' trainings, one at 8:30 on Saturday morning and another after the potluck luncheon and her keynote address, at 2:30 on Saturday. Silent Auction: Contributions Needed for Regional Meeting

If you're a quilter and would like to make an iris-related wall hanging, or if you are a sculptor who makes beautiful garden ornaments, or if you see some great bargain in the next few weeks as you are perusing the garden centers and stores that you know would do well in the auction, please consider making a contribution of that item to the auction. You may have a very special iris that you can pot now and bring, especially if it's a new introduction. Be creative and think about what you would buy at the auction, and go from there.

It is assumed that one person from each local club will be responsible for bringing the items but if you have another way you prefer to get them to the meeting, we're open to any suggestions.

Silent auction **set-up** will begin on Friday evening at 4:00 and continue the next morning between 8 and 9 a.m. The silent auction bidding begins at 9:30 and all the paperwork has to be in order before we open, so **be sure to let us know in advance what you're bringing** and be sure to bring it on Friday evening or before 9:00 on Saturday.
