Wasn't that an interesting iris season! Our iris bloom was a week to 10 days ahead of last year but there was more bloom than we've seen in years. Siberians were blooming the last week of May...not seen in 10 years...and Spurias were blooming the first week of June...unusual, but not unheard of. Before the middle of June, we were clearing our garden of spent bloom stalks as most TBs had finished blooming. By the end of June, only the Spurias had a few remaining flowers.

Fortunately, our show was June 2nd. Due to the early season, there were fewer entries, but it was a fabulous day with lots of people dropping by to admire the bloom stalks and pick up a new iris or two from the potted iris sale. Read about it on page 3.

President's Pointers

Have you been to the ONIS annual rhizome auction and sale? If you haven't, you're missing out on an opportunity to buy irises at very reasonable prices. There are two ways to do this, buy from the table sales or bid on rhizomes offered in the auction.

What are Table Sales?

The iris rhizomes in this part of the sale are donated by ONIS members from their personal collections. This is the time of year when we dig and divide our irises. Rather than toss the extras, we ask members to donate them to the sale. Prices typically range from \$2 to \$6 per rhizome depending on the size. There is a variety of irises available, MDBs, medians, TBs, and depending on the season you may even find some Siberians or Spurias. For ONIS members, the doors open at 12 noon. At 12:30 pm the sale opens to the public.

(Please note, table sales are suspended during the auction but resume once it's over...so you can keep shopping until the doors close at 3:30 pm.)

About The Auction

If you've still got money burning a hole in your wallet after shopping the table sales, you can stick around and participate in the auction which starts at 1:00 pm. Careful though...bidding can get lively!



This year's rhizomes are from Mid-America Garden in Oregon. We ordered a selection of newer tall bearded and median irises. At last year's auction, the irises offered retailed between \$25 US and \$65 US. In the end, the average bid was \$17 CDN...and there were no additional fees for a phytosanitary certificate and shipping. You'd be hard pressed to find a better deal.

Every bidder receives an auction booklet which lists the irises up for auction and a picture of each one. Arrive early to get your bidder's number.

Want You Can Do to Help

The success of the table sales is dependent upon our members donating rhizomes. If you are attending this event, bring your donations with you. Irises should be washed, trimmed, and labelled with their cultivar name (see picture below). Please note, only named varieties will be accepted. Arrive by 11:00 am so the set-up committee can price and sort. If you email me the cultivar names beforehand, we'll bring pictures to show off your rhizomes.

ONIS Annual Flower Show

We were back at the Toronto Botanical Garden (TBG) after a 5-year hiatus. The last year we held an iris show was 2019. According to the Summer edition of *The Iris Standard* that year, the iris bloom was a week to 10 days <u>behind</u> a 'normal' season. The show was mainly median irises with an abundance of intermediate beardeds (IB). Quite a contrast from what we experienced this year!

This year most of us found our irises blooming a week to 10 days <u>ahead</u> of a 'normal' season. By the day of the show, the median irises were pretty much done, except for some MTBs, and early tall-bearded irises were waning. As a result, the show was a mix of late blooming tall-bearded irises and Siberians. This was great for visitors who got to see irises that aren't usually available for an early June show. I even got to exhibit some of my Siberian seedlings...which was a first.

Six exhibitors entered 39 bloom stalks into the show. This included two of our youth members who also acted as our welcome ambassadors, greeting visitors at the door and explaining the People's Choice ballot to them. As always, the ballot was very popular, generating a lot of 'debate' between participants. It's always fun to watch them agonize over which irises are their favourites.

Annual Online Sale

It's time for the Ontario Iris Society (ONIS) online rhizome sale. 'The List' of available irises will be emailed to our fee-paying members and posted on the ONIS website: Ontario Iris Society - Auctions and Sales (google.com). To ensure everything runs as smoothly as possible here are some guidelines.

Please read carefully

REQUIREMENT TO PARTICIPATE

Anyone who lives in Canada can participate.

SALE PERIOD

ONIS MEMBERS: as a perk for fee-paying ONIS members, you can start placing your orders beginning at noon (ET) on Friday, July 12th.

NON-MEMBERS: beginning at noon (ET) on Monday, July 15th, the sale will be open to Canadian residents who are not fee-paying ONIS members.

Sale closes Saturday, July 20th at midnight (ET).

RHIZOME AVAILABILITY

Some varieties are limited in number so order early. Orders will be allocated on a 'first come, first served' basis. Since we want to make as many iris lovers as possible happy, please order only 1 or 2 rhizomes per cultivar. <u>Substitutions are welcome.</u> Mark these in your order with 's' or 'sub'.

PHOTOGRAPHS

All varieties on the list will have a link to the American Iris Society's Iris Encyclopaedia (aka the AIS IRIS WIKI). Click on the link to view pictures and details. If clicking on the link does not work, copy, and paste the link into your browser.

INDICATION OF REBLOOM AND/OR HISTORIC

Cultivars indicating 'rebloom' are listed as such on the AIS WIKI. It does not guarantee the iris will rebloom in your part of Canada.

Varieties classified as 'historic' were registered with the AIS 30 or more years ago (1994 and before).

PRICING

Prices are as indicated in the '2024 On-Line Sale List'. Prices do not include shipping.

Fee-paying ONIS members receive a \$1/rhizome discount. If non-members are ordering more than 10 rhizomes, they may want to consider joining our group. A 1-year e-membership is \$10. Other rates can be found on the ONIS website Ontario Iris Society (google.com).

SHIPPING CHARGES

Shipping rates continue to rise however we have decided to maintain the same shipping charges as last year.

Ontario & Quebec residents

1 – 9 rhizomes: \$22.00

10 or more rhizomes: \$22.00 plus \$0.50 for each rhizome over 9.

Pick-up available in the GTA area. Let us know and arrangements can possibly be made.

Residents Outside of Ontario and Quebec

1 – 9 rhizomes: \$27.00

10 or more rhizomes: \$27.00 plus \$0.50 for each rhizome over 9.
